Head Lice Alert:

We have had three classrooms with confirmed cases of head lice. Please read the following information from our Public Health Nurse.

Reminder about head lice:

Talk to the pharmacist about products for head lice. If you use an insecticidal product, use it exactly as recommended.

It has been documented that some head lice are resistance to the insecticidal products. There is a method to get rid of head lice without using the chemicals. See you tube video.
