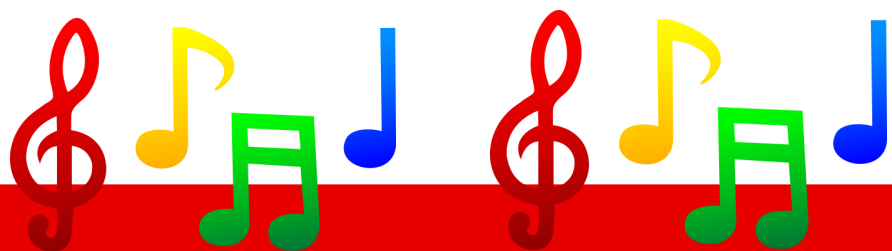
SHORELINE MUSIC CONCERT

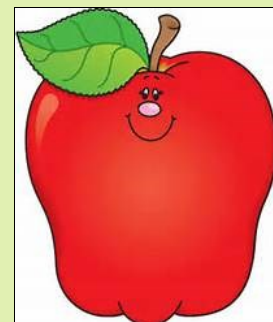
