1. Welcome and Call to Order
 - Territorial Acknowledgement
2. Approval of Minutes from last meeting.
3. Approval of Agenda
 - Added View Royal Transportation Survey to New Business
 - Approved by consensus.
4. Administrator's Report
 - Construction zone in school currently, the new classroom is coming along. Hopefully ready to use after Christmas Break.
 - MDI (Mental Development Index) information went out to parents. Helps to inform school goals.
 - Student Affordability Fund (SAF) - BC Government initiative to support families in times of increasing costs. District received \$1.9 million. Shoreline received \$47,200. Providing service to almost 60 families in addition to other supports.
 - Coats for kids are being collected.
 - Proficiency based reporting will be shown on report cards coming out this Friday. Words instead of letter grades, reflecting skill based approach.
 - First community breakfast was November 23. Close to 300 people attended. Plan on another towards the end of January.
 - Friday will be a Santa's Pancake breakfast for students. There will be three sittings for the meal, followed by rotation through activities for the morning.
 - Sales: Grilled cheese on Mondays, Pizza on Thursdays. Money supports programs at the school.
 - Winter concerts were well attended.
 - Winter formal - led by GSA was Friday December 2.

- Holiday challenges for classes: different challenges each week, bringing in non-perishable food items, door decorating challenges, gingerbread house making, word scramble...
- Winter Sale - hosted by Ms Labell's class Monday and Tuesday this week.
- Candy Cane sales - led by Student Council.
- December 5, Gautam and Micha gave out gift cards from the PAC and thanked them from PAC and Administration for all of their hard work so far this year.
- Scholastic Book Fair in the library last week. Very successful.
- Basketball season is done, starting volleyball season. Tryouts for volleyball are this week. Also anticipate intramural volleyball.
- Rugby Academy is ongoing.
- A lot of hard work is going into the musical as things get going. Coming May 2023.
- Big Canoe is ongoing.
- Humble Hooves, first session complete. New set of students going out in the New Year.
- Approximately 14 different clubs are ongoing.
- Many other things are currently going on in the school.
- Shoreline has received a donation of \$103 000 from the Community School, made to the school district from when the Community School organization disbanded. Money is to be shared with View Royal and Craigflower School, aimed at transitional activities for students.
- Concern from a teacher raised today regarding online content that students have access to - discussion. Possible topic for Parent Education.
