**ADMINISTRATORS REPORT**

Many events and activities happening around the school on going and upcoming. Items of note:

- Elders tea held on Monday November 18<sup>th</sup> was well received and attended by members of the community, would like to continue these events throughout the year
- Remembrance Day ceremony was well attended, thank you to all who were able to share the time. Members of the community, student participation and faculty support made the event special for all
- School goals were reviewed and potentially adjusted
  - o Few years ago it was noticed a low level as well as 2-3 grade level below for students in literacy and competency, Shoreline started doing assessments and from the findings adjusted teaching practice
  - o Created positive environments to learn, Shoreline began program called TRI (Targeted Reading Intervention), students started taking ownership and inspiration from reading groups and have asked for this program to help their learning
